

#### ANNUAL REPORT

Founded with the blessings of Ma with the principal object of rendering service to the suffering humanity, irrespective of any distinction whatsover, this hospital, with perhaps the best possible frontage in the holy city of Varanasi, has already completed 38 years of its existence.

Through the combined efforts of all concerned the hospital has shown marked progress in its working. During the year under review total 57,430 patients were treated free in the various Out-Patient Deptts, e.g. Medical, Surgical, Cardiology, Opthalmic, E.N.T., Urology, Ano-rectal, Gynaec, Paediatrics, Neurology, Dental, Orthopoedics, Skin, Ayurvedic and also Physio-therapy. In all 1889 patients were treated in the Indoor during the year under review.

#### FREE MEDICAL AID PROGRAMME

The Management of the hospital organised free medical aid programmes for rendering maximum possible service to the poor and the needy.

Special Surgical Camp was organised in the hospital between 15th December, 2006 and 15th January, 2007 mainly for treatment of Hernia & Hydrocele cases under the direct supervision of the renowned surgeons, Dr. N.N. Khanna, Dr. B.N. S. Bhatnagar and Dr. K.N. Tripathy. 497 cases were examined free in the Surgical O.P.D. and 40 operations, including of Appendicitis etc. were done completely free, along with free investigations, free bed and free diet etc.

In the Free Eye Camp 485 eye patients were examined free along with free investigations. 72 free eye operations were done, of which 27 were cataract cases and 45 intra-ocular lens transplantations.

Thanks are specially due for dedicated service to the renowned eye surgeon, Dr. S. Thakur, assisted by Dr. R.M. Bajpayee, Dr. Sangeeta Thakur, Dr. P.C. Dwivedi and Dr. Pratima Nath.

A special Urology Camp was also organised in the hospital on 3rd June, 2006 under the expert guidance of our Senior Urologist, Dr. K. Pandey, through which specially old people, mainly sadhus, were greatly benefited.

The Polio eradication programme was organised regularly in the hospital on various dates in co-operation with the Govt. Health Deptt. and Rotary Club, Varanasi North.

Through the assistance of M/s. Lupin Pharma Ltd., and under the expert guidance of Dr. A.K. Deb, our Consultant Physician, free Asthma and Chest Disease Camp was organised once a month in our hospital through-out the year. There was regular rush of poor patients on all the days.

# GANGA AMBULANCE SEVA AND RURAL HEALTH PROGRAMME

Series of free medical camps were organised at different places of Varanasi and even outside the district exclusively for the benefit of the poor and the needy, where proper medical aid is not available at all. In all 7,862 patients were examined and necessary treatment given to all. Costly medicines received mainly through Shri Dindayal Jalan of Varanasi, and a few other reputed medical concerns were freely utilized and distributed in those camps. Thanks are specially due to Sri Vishnu Surekha of New-Delhi for donating medicines worth more than a couple of lakhs during the year 2006-2007.

Particular mention should be made in this connection about the Special Camp organised at distant Vindhyachal in February, 2007 and two others at Dagmagpur near Chunar, organised by Sri Kishori Lal Jalan Seva Trust in November, 2006 and March, 2007. All the camps were no doubt very special ones, attended by very senior and renowned doctors of Varanasi, like Dr. H. S. Bajpayi (Physician), Dr. N. N. Khanna (Surgeon), Dr. J.K. Agrawal (Endocrinologist), Dr. R.G. Tandon (E.N.T. Specialist), Dr. P.V. Tewari (Gynaecologist), Dr. V.K. Agrawal (Neurologist), Dr. K. Pandey (Uro-Surgeon), Dr. G.M. Lal (Orthopoedic Surgeon), Dr. R.K.Kesarwani (Radiologist) and a host of other doctors and specialists. A unique feature of those camps were that even the costly Ultra-sound unit was taken there and a number of patients took benefit of the same. Maximum number of patients appeared to be of Medical, Eye, Surgical and Skin diseases. A good number of complicated cases were referred by the doctors to our hospital for necessary investigations and further treatment and even admission completely free of charge. More than half a dozen surgery cases were also done later on in our hospital, without any payment whatsoever.

An absolutely new project was taken up this year on the occasion of the Kumbh Mela at Allahabad in January, 2007. Special Medical Relief Camp was organised there for the benefit of hundreds of pilgrims gathering for the Kumbh Mela. This was highly appreciated by all concerned, including the Mela administration. More than 2.275 patients were very much benefited, for which all of them expressed their sincere gratefulness:

The main credit for organising these free camps even in far off places, goes specially to our Eye Surgeon-cum-Dy. Chief Medical Officer, Dr. P. C. Dwivedi and to Sri Partho Brahmachari, the General Suptd. of the hospital.

The spirit of dedication and feeling of real concern for the sick, evinced by our doctors for the welfare of the sick is really very encouraging. And that indeed is the main support of our Ganga Ambulance Seva and Rural Health Programme.

#### THALASSEMIA DAY-CARE CENTRE

The Varanasi Region Thalassemia Welfare Society, which has been running the centre in our hospital, worked with dedication in order to prevent spread of the dreadful disease among the children. The main object is to identify the life-taking disease among the children and also to ensure their proper treatment.

Allotment of a special cabin in the wards by the hospital management for this noble work has brought about a significant improvement in the management and care of thalassemia patients. Monthly growth monitoring clinics are also regularly conducted on second Sunday of every month.

During the year under review total number of transfusions carried out at the centre was 246. Total number of haemoglo-binopathies crossed 630 and symptomatic/index cases were 284. Total number of registered thalassemics was 75 for regular care and management by the centre. 40 units of blood was very kindly provided free by LM.A. members.

A filip was provided to the Prevention Program with the new procedure for pre-natal diagnosis successfully done by the working Group.

A computer acquired with the help of Lions Club has also greatly helped the working of the centre.

The selfless efforts of Dr. (Mrs.) Sujata Sinha and Dr. (Mrs.) Sangeeta Kumar in this respect are indeed very much praise worthy.

#### THE YEAR AT A GLANCE

We are indeed happy to note that through the combined efforts of all concerned the hospital has shown progress in its working, thus enabling us to fulfil our objective, "Roga-rupi Jana Janārdana Sevā" as ordained by Ma.

#### SPECIAL FUNCTIONS

- (i) A special function was organised on 5th May, 2006 on the occasion of the formal inauguration of the costly new O. T. light, purchased out of the grant of Rs. 2.00 lakhs sanctioned out of M. P. Fund. Dr. A. P. Singh, Chief Medical Officer, Varanasi was personally present on the occasion, who was quite pleased with the functioning of our O. T. Deptt.
- (ii) As in previous years, a week-long free eye check-up camp was organised in the hospital under the auspices of the Rotary Club, Varanasi Elite, in the last week of July and in a special function held on 1st August, 2006, 128 spects were given free of cost to the needy, majority of whom were very old *mahatmas*.
- (iii) On the occasion of the 60th Independence Day celebration which was held in a dignified manner in the hospital premises on August 15, 2006, the National Flag was hoisted by Hon'ble S.P. Jaiswal ex-M.P. and Hon'ble Sri S. D. Roychoudhury M.L.A., ex-Minister. U.P. The function started with the National song, sung by the staff and students of the Ma Anandamayee Kanyapeeth in the presence of Sri Jyotirmay Roy, Dy. Gen. Manager, UCO Bank, as the Guest of Honour and many other distinguished citizens of the city and doctors and staff of the hospital.

As in prevoius years, packets containing fruits and biscuits were distributed among all the patients by the Chief Guest and thereafter in the memory of late Kalachand Brahmachari, a veteran freedom fighter of the twenties, cloths and food packets were distributed among 101 children of the poor. This special function was organised in accordance with the wishes of Sri Tushar Ghosh of Bangalore.

(iv) During the year under review National Flag was also hoisted in the hospital on 26th January, 2006, Republic Day. On this occasion also fruits etc. were distributed among all the patients personally by Dr. H. S. Bajpayi, Vice-President of the Hospital Managing Committee.

(v) Swami Brahmanandaji Maharaj, head of the Vedanta Mission, Kolkata, kindly visited the hospital on 6th February, 2007 and distributed packets of fruits etc. among all the patients.

#### FINANCIAL STATUS

The Poor Relief Fund, created specially for the purpose of rendering as much medical help as possible to the really deserving persons, seems now to be quite inadequate. The demand from the poor people of Varanasi city and even from the rural areas as well as from the neighbouring districts has been steadily on the rise. During the year under review our expenditure only on Medical Relief to the Poor exceeded Rs. 4.58 lakhs.

Keeping our firm faith in Sri Ma's divine grace we only pray to Her to bestow upon us the capacity to meet this ever-increasing demand for Jan Janārdana Seva.

### GOVERNMENT GRANT

The hospital is deeply indebted to the State Govt. for the annual grant of Rs. 8.83 lakhs which has indeed gone a long way to meet our mounting deficit.
